Project Description:

The project was to provide new lighting scheme, rewiring and redecoration of the church located on the Boulevard in Kingston upon Hull.



The Church was constructed in the 1950s using concrete trusses and solid floors. The project followed a successful project to re-wire the adjoining presbytery some years before.

The scheme included new mains distribution, emergency lighting, general power installations, security system, public address and heating system controls.

The new design had to provide better general illumination, attractive lighting and highlighting of various spaces in the church such as the sanctuary and altar. The scheme also had to be delivered within a controlled budget and with minimal disruption to the use of the church. There was little existing conduit that met the needs of the improved lighting design and nature of the building did not permit easy flush wiring and so the project presented a challenge in avoiding obtrusive use of surface fixed systems.

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
